

MARIPOSA COUNTY SUPERIOR COURT
EMERGENCY BAIL SCHEDULE

(EFFECTIVE 4/13/20 UNTIL 90 DAYS AFTER THE GOVERNOR DECLARES THAT
THE STATE OF EMERGENCY RELATED TO COVID-19 IS LIFTED)

Pursuant to Emergency Rule 4 adopted by the Judicial Council of California on April 6,
2020, the Mariposa County Superior Court adopts this Emergency Bail Schedule.

1. \$0 Bail for Certain Offenses

Bail for all misdemeanors and felony offenses is \$0, with the exception of the following
offenses:

- a. A serious felony as defined in Penal Code section 1192.7(c);
- b. A violent felony as defined in Penal Code section 667.5(c);
- c. A felony violation of Penal Code section 69;
- d. A violation of Penal Code section 166(c)(1);
- e. A violation of Penal Code section 136.1 punishable under section 136.1(c);
- f. A violation of Penal Code section 262;
- g. A violation of Penal Code sections 243(e)(1) or 273.5;
- h. A violation of Penal Code section 273.6, if the detained person made threats to kill or
harm, has engaged in violence against, or has gone to the residence or workplace of, the
protected party;
- i. A felony violation of Penal Code section 422;
- j. A violation of Penal Code section 646.9;
- k. A violation of an offense listed in Penal Code section 290(c);
- l. A violation of Vehicle Code sections 23152 or 23153;
- m. A felony violation of Penal Code section 463; and
- n. A violation of Penal Code section 29800.

2. Ability to Deny Bail

The court retains the ability to deny bail as authorized by article I, section 12 or 28(f)(3) of
the California Constitution.

3. Application of Existing Countywide Bail Schedule

The current countywide bail schedule remains in effect for all offenses listed in 1(a)-(n),
including any count-specific conduct enhancements and any status enhancements.

The court retains the authority to reduce the amount of bail listed in 1(a)-(n), or for any offenses not in conflict with this Emergency Bail Schedule.

4. Bail for Violations of Post-Conviction Supervision

- a. Bail for all violations of misdemeanor probation, whether the arrest is with or without a bench warrant is \$0.
- b. Bail for all violations of felony probation, parole, post-release community supervision, or mandatory supervision, must be set in accord with this Emergency Bail Schedule, or for the bail amount in the countywide schedule of bail for charges of conviction listed in 1(a)-(n), including any enhancements.
